

International Basic Education Funding Needs Fiscal Year 2022

Education is a force-multiplier for international development with a high return on investment. For every \$1 spend on education, as much as \$15 is generated in economic growth. Prior to the COVID-19 emergency, 258 million children were out of school. At the height of the crisis, this number increased six-fold.

Now more than ever, we must maintain our existing investments in children and young people around the world while scaling up effective interventions to respond to the COVID-19 emergency and begin to rebuild. Failing to act risks losing decades of progress in global education and severely limiting the opportunities for a generation of young people. In contrast, a unified global effort could not only stave off the worst impacts of the virus, but could lay the foundation for fundamental improvements

Topline: \$1.1 billion, including:


- \$900 million bilateral
- \$150 million Global Partnership for Education (GPE)
- \$50 million Education Cannot Wait (ECW)

COVID-19 Relief Package: \$20 billion is needed for international response, including at least \$300 million additional funding for international education, with:

- \$235 million bilateral
- \$50 million GPE
- \$15 million ECW
